Abbi's favorite activities began with walking, running, and chasing her sister Indi. If she could she would have herded cars, bicycles and horses, something she attempted to do while on her leash. She enjoyed rides in the car, except the ones to the vet. Abbi was known as a picket pocket. Visitors were always warned to set their purses/wallets off the ground because Abbi would find the cash or the Kleenex. Her favorite vacation spot was Michigan. Her and her sister attracted many people as they strolled through the streets of Frankenmuth, Harbor Springs, Petoskey, Mackinaw City and their favorite place Mackinac Island. Abbi loved the horses. She loved the Mission Point Hotel as they accommodated her in the hotel and even in a particular dining area near the water.

Although she was shy, she always greeted you with a smile and a wagging tail. Later in life she enjoyed her strolls in her pink Cadillac and blue Lincoln.

More than anything else, Abbi loved her Mom. She was always there to greet her with kisses and share what she did throughout the day. She was her Mom's constant companion, through heartache and grief after Indi's passing. She kept the joy. Abbi was good at a lot of things in particular food puzzles. She would never go hungry as she always found the food and was able to get the pieces out. Later in life she wrote the annual Christmas letter through her eyes. But she was best at unconditional love. She taught everyone she met about loving people, and always seeing the good in everyone.

Abbi was a warrior when it came to health. She often had reactions to flea and tick meds. She injured her ACL when she was 8 years. But with weeks of water therapy she was back to normal. She had her gallbladder removed when she was 12. She reinjured her ACL when she was 13 and went back for water therapy. She had a Grand Mal seizure at age 14. The Emergency Vet wanted to put her down back then. We started the CBD oil no other medication and she never had another one after that. She changed her eating habits after her sister was diagnosed with cancer. Mom decided to cook fresh food for her every day. Abbi took her supplements and even went for acupuncture and laser therapy. This past March 2020 she had a cancerous tumor removed from under her armpit but recovered without any issues. Abbi's back legs were very weak as she had three compressed vertebrae. We purchased her a wheel chair so she could stand without being afraid her legs would give out. However she preferred walking with her handicap harness.

Abbi's death was suddenly taken away by kidney disease.
